QUESTION 4

How can you exclude the /Users/anna/Downloads/ folder from Time Machine backups?

- B. In Finder, control-click the Downloads folder for the anna account, click the Sharing and Permissions disclosure triangle, click the Add (+) button, add anna to the list of users, and set the Time Machine user\\'s access to No Access.
- C. In Terminal, execute the command sudo defaults write/Library/Preferences/com.apple.TimeMachineexcludedFolders -array- add/Users/anna/Downloads.

QUESTION 6

When Time Machine backed up your file yesterday, the file was 5MB. Now that you\\'ve changed the file, it\\'s 6MB.

What does Time Machine do with the file at the next backup?
